Mission

Protect children from abuse and neglect; to preserve families, whenever possible; and to assure permanency, that is, to provide permanent, safe homes for children either by assuring safety within the child's own family, or by finding an adoptive home or another permanent setting for those children who cannot be reunified with their family.

Department Overview	
Calls logged – CY 2019	17,734 calls of suspected child abuse/neglect were received by CYF. 45% (7,968) were screened out at intake.
	44% (7,851) were assigned to a caseworker for a full investigation.
	20% of these (1,567) were accepted for child welfare services
	11% of these (1,897) were connected to active cases
	80% (1,511) were related to open cases
People served* – CY 2019	8,478 children; 12,786 adults
	On July 7, 2020, 3,860 children in 1,807 families were receiving services. 1,547 of these children were in out-of-home placement. 1,430 were in foster care. About two-thirds of those in out-of-home placement were placed with kin.
